YOUR HORSE MIGHT HAVE UNDIAGNOSED **EQUINE GASTRIC ULCER SYNDROME (EGUS)**

Studies have identified that 3 out of 4 Australian horses suffer from gastric ulcers. Ulcers are formed when the mucosal lining of the stomach is eroded due to excessive levels of gastric acid production. The severity of ulceration is graded from 0 (normal) to 4 (severe), which is identified by performing a "Gastroscope."
